

COVID FUNDING UPDATE

- As a result of the pandemic, GRPS received several sources of additional funding. These include local, state and federal sources.
 - Private donations
 - State Section 103(2) District COVID Costs
 - Kent County CARES
 - State Section 11P Coronavirus Relief Funds
 - MI Connect Device
 - Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Formula
 - ESSER Education Equity
 - Governors Education Emergency Relief (GEER)
 - Emergency Connectivity Fund
 - ESSER II
 - ARP/ESSER III

COVID Funding At the start of the pandemic, several local individuals and foundations provided funds to support the district transition to virtual learning.

Private Donations

- > \$436,488 Fully expended
- Hotspots, service and software

Section 103(2) District COVID Costs

- In the district July 2020 state aid payment, a new categorical funding was received to be used in 2020-2021. This was federal funding allocated to districts.
- \$190,421 Fully expended
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and cleaning supplies

Kent County CARES

In late 2020, Kent County allocated a portion of the CARES Act funding to local school districts.

- > \$358,992 Fully expended
- > PPE, cleaning supplies and air purifiers

In August 2020, the State provided a new allocation of federal funding (\$350 per pupil).

Section 11P Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF)

- > \$5,409,736 Fully expended
- Cleaning equipment, temperature kiosks, HVAC/ventilation audit of buildings, scholar and staff devices, classroom cameras, security supplies and equipment, instructional software, bus passes for scholars to come to school for SAT testing while the district was in remote learning

Michigan Connect Device

- The district received funding related to one of the student device purchases.
- ⋟ \$5,344 Fully expended
- Student devices

- MDE allocated funds received under the federal CARES Act to school districts. A portion of the GRPS district allocation had to be allocated to private schools within the GRPS district boundaries. This funding does not have a supplanting prohibition.
- \$7,990,554 GRPS: \$7,519,111

Private Schools: \$ 471,443

ESSER Formula

- GRPS fully expended allocation. Private schools utilized \$450,154 of their available funds.
- Instructional supplies, additional special ed services, translation costs, PPE, cleaning supplies, technology devices, software, hotspot service, custodial salaries/benefits, custodial purchased services, security salaries/benefits, MIS salaries/benefits

MDE allocated funds received under the federal CARES Act to school districts. A portion of the GRPS allocation had to be allocated to private schools within the GRPS district boundaries.

ESSER Education Equity

- \$1,589,111 GRPS: \$1,494,822 Private Schools: \$ 94,289
- GRPS fully expended their allocation. Private schools utilized \$90,926 of their available funds.
- Technology devices, software, hotspot service, mental health therapists salaries/benefits, behavioral health supervisor salary/benefits

- MDE allocated federal funds to school districts. A portion of the allocation had to be allocated to private schools within the district boundaries.
- \$1,549,503 GRPS: \$1,458,082
 Private schools: \$91,421
- GRPS fully expended our allocation. Private schools utilized \$82,563 of their available funds.
- Technology devices, hotspots, water coolers/drinking fountains, custodial equipment, air purifiers, HVAC/ventilation audit of buildings

GEER

Emergency Connectivity Fund Congress authorized the Emergency Connectivity Fund as part of the American Rescue Plan Act. The GRPS application for devices and hot spot service was approved.

> \$3,523,579

- GRPS had expenses of \$3,075,843 eligible for reimbursement.
- Student devices, hotspot service

- > MDE allocated funds to school districts.
- > \$32,921,552
- GRPS had expenses of \$23,614,883 eligible for reimbursement through June 30,2022.

ESSER II

- Funds must be used by September 30, 2023
- Curriculum, tutoring, student devices, classroom technology systems, technology supplies, software, summer school, professional learning, hotspot service, custodial salaries/benefits, custodial purchased services, security salaries/benefits, MIS salaries/benefits, PPE, cleaning supplies, translation, transportation, operations/maintenance vehicles



- MDE allocated funds to school districts.
- > \$73,989,706
- GRPS had expenses of \$3,301,261 eligible for reimbursement through June 30, 2022.

Funds must be used by September 30, 2024

Curriculum, tutoring, academic supplies, instructional services, enrichment trips, dual enrollment, mental health therapist salaries/benefits, professional learning, student devices, software

ARP / ESSER III

ESSER III Expenditures As of June 30, 2022 Curriculum Other Expense 7% 9% Tutoring Professional Learning 5% 4% Indirect 4% Software 4% Technology 20% Academic support & enrichment 47%
