For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

About Our School

Mulick Park Elementary School is located on the southeast side of Grand Rapids and serves students in grades Pre-K through five. It is adjacent to land owned by the city that is used for recreational activities (tennis courts, baseball diamonds, football/soccer practice fields and water activities). Built in 1952, the school serves over 260 students, including students with cognitive impairments. All teachers are highly qualified by State of Michigan teaching standards. Over 90% of teachers hold master's degrees. Over the last five years, state assessment scores have increased. For the past three years, Mulick has been part of the Michigan Integrated Behavior and Support Initiative where positive behavior and reading are the focus. Alger Middle School and Ottawa Hills High School are feeder schools for students in the Mulick Park attendance area.
