

Safety & Security

THE RAPTOR

We will be using the Raptor security system at RPM this year. If you plan to come into the building (beyond the entrance vestibule) you will need to provide your driver's license to be run through the Raptor. You will then receive a sticker to show you have been approved for entry into the classroom area.



Drop Off/Pick Up

"Kiss & Go" traffic lane rules:

Stay in your vehicle
Students exit/enter vehicles on the school side only
Follow the traffic pattern to turn around
Do not block the bus lane
Do Not Stop in Cross Walk

If you want to walk your child to the door please park in the lot.

Parking Lot rules:

Park in the lot and walk your children across the traffic lane
