Affective Statements

Characteristics of High-Quality Affective Statements and Language:

- Teaches empathy, sets boundaries, and provides feedback.
- Encourages scholars to be aware of the positive or negative impact of their behavior.
- Provides an explicit explanation of emotions.
- Does NOT protect scholars from the consequences of their behavior.
- Focuses on the behavior, NOT on the intrinsic worth of the person (separates the deed from doer).
- Are respectful in tone.
- Encourages scholars to express feelings.
- Five positives to one corrective statement.

Affective Statement Sentence stems:

I feel proud because/when ... I feel excited because/when ... I feel appreciative because/when... I feel grateful because/when.... I feel thankful because/when... I feel delighted because/when ...
